AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SOUTH MIAMI, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 4 "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES," ARTICLE I "IN GENERAL," SECTION 4-2 "CONDITIONAL USE APPROVAL OF REQUIREMENTS; NONCONFORMING USE; CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY", AND CHAPTER IS "OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS", ARTICLE I "IN GENERAL," SECTION 1S-63 "MOBILE VENDORS," OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES, TO MODIFY CONDITIONS RELATING TO FOOD SERVICE IN CONNECTION WITH THE SERVICE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES INCLUDING ALLOWING MOBILE FOOD VENDORS FOR DRINKING PLACE/BAR/LOUNGE WITHIN THE HOMETOWN DISTRICT UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR CORRECTIONS; SEVERABILITY; CONFLICTS; IMPLEMENTATION; AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Summary of Proposed Ordinance and Statement of Public Purpose to be Served

Ordinance purposes to amend/modify conditions relating to food service in connection with the service of alcohol beverages.
